## SUMMARY ANNUAL REPORT FOR PLUMBERS' WELFARE FUND, LOCAL 130, U.A.

This is a summary of the annual report for the Health and Welfare Plan of the Plumbers' Welfare Fund, Local 130, U.A., EIN 36-4026252 for the year ended May 31, 2016. The annual report has been filed with the Employee Benefit Security Administration, as required under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

### Basic Financial Statement

Benefits under the plan are provided by Trust.

Plan expenses were \$61,476,066, consisting of \$58,716,764 of benefits paid to participants and beneficiaries, \$1,056,173 of professional fees, \$311,748 of investment fees and \$1,391,381 of other administrative fees.

The value of plan assets, after subtracting liabilities of the plan, was \$137,540,188 as of May 31, 2016, compared to \$135,328,891 as of June 1, 2015. During the year, the plan experienced an increase in its net assets of \$2,211,297. This increase included unrealized appreciation or depreciation in the value of the plan assets; that is, the difference between the value of the plan's assets at the end of the year and the value of the assets at the beginning of the year or the cost of assets acquired during the year. The plan had total income of \$63,687,363 including (but not limited to) participant contributions of \$571,575, employer contributions of \$62,005,355 and earnings from investments of \$1,110,412.

You have the right to receive a copy of the full annual report, or any part thereof, upon request. The items listed below are included in that report:

an accountant's report;

financial information and information on payments to service providers;

information regarding any common or collective trusts, pooled separate accounts, master trusts or 103-12 investment entities in which the plan participates;

fiduciary information, including non-exempt transactions between the plan and parties-in-interest (that is, persons who have certain relationships with the plan);

assets held for investment; and

transactions in excess of 5 percent of plan assets.

If you request a copy of the full annual report from the Fund Administrator, these two statements and accompanying notes will be included as part of that report. The charge to cover the copying costs given above does not include a charge for the copying of these portions of the report because these portions are furnished without charge.

You also have the legally protected right to examine the annual report at the main office of the plan at 1340 West Washington Boulevard, Chicago, IL 60607 and the U.S. Department of Labor in Washington, D.C., or to obtain a copy from the U.S. Department of Labor upon payment of copying costs.
